

## **WSDOT seeks shoreline changes on Portage Bay; public comment meeting scheduled Oct. 5**

This August, the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) applied to the City of Seattle for a series of permits that, if granted, will permanently change the character of Portage Bay and other shoreline areas adjacent to SR-520.

Urging the City to deny these permits, the Coalition for a Sustainable SR-520 submitted a detailed summary of its reasons why to the Seattle Department of Planning and Development (DPD) this week.
